YNTP's objective is to provide Person Centered Care and assist individuals in their road to recovery and intervene in the progressive stages of substance use from mild to the moderate impaired to the chronic and severely dependent.

To assist the individual to recognize substance use as a disease and motivate them toward sobriety, recovery and a more satisfying lifestyle.

Each individual shall be treated in a manner that promotes dignity self-respect and responsibility in their own recovery.

YNTP serves as a referral and resource center to Yakama Nation Tribal members, descendants and from other federally recognized tribes that reside on or near the reservation boundaries who are affected by substance abuse.

What do we offer as a program?

We offer a physically comfortable and emotionally safe therapeutic recovery environment for our patients.

Our intent is to provide resources to assist individuals with the transition from possible substance use disorder into sobriety and or recovery.
